


- Mobile communication is typically decent throughout the walk. - UHF radios should maintain communications with the car park throughout, if brought. - Runners can be employed to the car park, a person at a brisk pace can be back with 30 minutes from any point on the route. - A check in time will be set, that if we have not checked in by this time to escalate. - No water on site, will need to be brought in with us. Notes for teachers locations or cancellation may be advised.

- Guide will check BOM for weather & current environmental warnings on the lead up & during the activity. Alternative
- All participants need: Sun hats, shirts, trousers or shorts to walk in (Weather dependant, no jeans), practical shoes to walk in, water bottle (Min 1L).
- Teachers will need to supply in advance information about their participants including; physical ability, allergies, medical conditions & other items that may impact an individuals ability to participate. This information will be used by the lead guide to best tailor the experience.
- The guide in addition will have: First aid kit, mobile phone, emergency response plans.
- Students need to be easily identified (High vis vests, school uniform shirts)
- Note no public toilets on site
